## Personal Care

Support with eating; bathing; toileting; dressing; grooming; getting in and out of bed; moving about the home; assistance with medications.

## Flexible Respite

Respite care supports you and your carer by giving you both a break for a short period of time. It can help give you and your carer the time and space to do things independently.

## Social Support Groups

Shopping Bus; Social Support Groups; Out & About; Health & Wellbeing; Aquatics Class; Morning Melodies.

# Social Support Individual

One-on-one service to promote social connection. It can either be in your home or out in the Community.

## Home Maintenance

Garden maintenance & minor home maintenance and repairs. Services must be linked to assisting clients maintain their independence & safety. For function & safety not aesthetic effect.

### Meals

Delivered meals, monthly Community Meal, Meal Voucher Program.

## Home Modifications

Simple home modifications & more complex modifications where clinically justified. An OT Assessment is required.

# Goods Equipment & Assistive Technology

## (GEAT)

Community aids; medical care aids; personal monitoring technology; reading aids; self-care aids; support & mobility aids. An OT Assessment is required.

# Allied Health - Occupational Therapy

Occupational Therapist can come to your home to assess supports you may require to stay safe and independent in your own home e.g hand rails, hand held shower heads ect.

## Domestic Assistance

Supporting you to maintain your independence with assistance of every day household tasks such as: basic house cleaning, clothes washing, dishwashing, shopping, paying bills, meal prep.
