Council's next meeting is this Tuesday September 21 at 6pm. The public are encouraged to get involved by watching the live stream or submitting a question via our website www.pyrenees.vic.gov.au/about-pyrenees-shire-council/council-meetings. Council will be looking to:

- Decide on a planning application for a telecommunications facility in Avoca;
- Receive the financial statements and performance statement for the year ending 30 June 2021;
- Endorse the 10-year Financial Plan to be released for public exhibition;
- Reinforce its commitment to the Communities of Respect and Equality (CoRE) Alliance, and thereby take a stand against Family Violence;
- Endorse the Reconciliation Plan and Protocol document committing to take action to support our Traditional Owners.

Bin Delivery Update

As we reported last week, all properties north and south of the Western Hwy should now have 240L waste and recycling bins. If you haven't received your 240L bins, please contact us. We expect to start delivering the much-delayed 120L glass bins next week – again, we apologise again for the delay. If you have an existing landfill bin with a burgundy or green lid, these will continue to be replaced over the coming months with a red lid, please be patient while the contractor gets to you. Lexton Median Strip

This recently completed project involved the replacement of the median strip on the Sunraysia Hwy (just north of its intersection with Williams St). The old median strip was identified for replacement in the Pyrenees Futures township plans. Contractor Fulton Hogan has now rebuilt the median strip slightly wider than the original, and once the new plantings get established the median strip will look much better. This project was funded through the Federal Government's Drought Community Program and cost \$75,000.
