### Krupp Gun to return to Beaufort

The Beaufort Returned Soldiers League (RSL) successfully obtained a grant to restore the Krupp

Gun that had been located outdoors in the Beaufort Bicentennial Park for many years.

Council and the RSL have worked together to identify three possible sites for the shelter and the gun, with Council voting at their June meeting to auspice the building of the shelter closest to the original position of the gun along Havelock Street.

Council will continue to work with the Beaufort RSL on developing this site for the return of the gun and the shelter design.

### Prioritising pedestrian safety on Homebush Road, Avoca

Pyrenees Shire Council has received grant funds under the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program (LRCIP) Round 3 for the construction of shared paths in Avoca.

Council will prioritize constructing footpaths to increase pedestrian safety and equitable access along Homebush Road and Boyce Street.

Council will work with the community with upcoming community engagement planned to gather feedback on the community's thoughts for where more footpaths may be needed in Beaufort and Avoca.

### Avoca Community Hubs Named

Council received government funding to develop two hubs in Avoca, refurbishing the old shire offices as a community hub or for business; and the development of a new digital hub at the rear of the Avoca Information Centre as a technology space for small or start-up businesses.

The new hub at the old shire offices will be named *The Gunga Community Hub*. The translation of Gunga is 'to do, to work, to create, to make something'.

The new digital hub at the rear of the Avoca Information Centre will be named *The Balaki Wuka Digital Hub*. The translation of Balaki Wuka is 'giving to community'.

These new facilities will be available for the local community and businesses in the next few months.

## Roadworks & Maintenance



### Floodway reconstruction on Mills Lane, Amphitheatre

Work is scheduled to start on June 21 and finish on July 12. There will be road closures with detour signage in place. These works are weather dependent, there may be a delay if there is significant rainfall.

### Avoca Pathway Repairs

Footpaths along High Street in Avoca will be repaired and replaced between July and August. Please be aware of these works and take care when walking around town.

### Raglan Elmhurst Road Bridge

Works on Bridge 139 at Raglan Elmhurst Road have been postponed and will start in around seven weeks. Third party phone cabling needs to be removed from the bridge before works can start.

### Carngham Streatham Road Bridge

Works on Bridge 32 on Carngham Streatham Road will begin soon. Signage and detours will be in place. Works are expected to finish around August.

### Lexton Floodways

Reconstruction of floodways on Yalong Road, Anderson Street and Williamson Street in Lexton has started. Some roads will be closed during these works. Signage showing detours is in place. Works are expected to be finished by mid-June.

### Avoca Digital Hub

Work on the Avoca Digital Hub is expected to be finished in late June. During this time, bookings for the two back rooms will be unavailable; however, other rooms will be able to be booked.

Bridge 139 – Raglan Elmhurst Road closed from mid-August to late-October
