## **Rural Finance Grants**

We have some great news to share!! The Rural Finance Primary Producer Recovery Grant and the



Rural Landholder Grant are now closing on 13 July 2023 not 30 April 2023. This gives more time to submit applications. We know landholders and farmers have been really busy since the floods in October/November 2022 and may not have had time to look into grants yet. It is really important to Council that landholders and farmers recover well, so we requested that grant closing dates be extended.

These grants cover activities like replacing or repairing essential equipment, fixing and replacing fencing, buying fodder, water and water storage, salvaging damaged crops, grain or feed, and hiring or purchasing materials to clean up a property or equipment.

You don't have to be a 'big' farmer to be eligible for the grants. Even if you think you may not be eligible or don't have a lot of time to look into the guidelines, it is worth a phone call to Rural Finance 1800 260 425 to find out. # Works on roads under the responsibility of Regional Roads Victoria

Below is an update on works on roads which are the responsibility of Regional Roads Victoria (RRV). These works are funded under the Victorian Government's Emergency Blitz Program. - Western Highway
  - Pavement patching west of Beaufort—completed.
  - Pavement patching between Beggs St and Beaufort Lexton Rd in Beaufort—completed.
- Skipton Road
  - Pavement patching between Millars Road and Stockyard Hill Road—in progress.
  - Shoulder top ups at various locations and clearing of debris from culverts between Cushing Road and Murray Street scheduled for completion at the end of May.
- Ararat-St Arnaud Road
  - Pavement patching between Degraves Road and Shays Flat Road—completed.
  - Minor bridge repairs on structures on Avoca-Stawell Road—in progress.
  - Cleaning of debris from culverts and erosion control from Potts Road to Gifford Road (not all in Pyrenees LGA) - in progress.
  - Shoulder top ups at various locations between Cemetery Road and Bennett Road—in progress.
- Sunraysia Highway
  - Asphalt patching and stabilisation works between Western Freeway exit and Dunolly Road—in progress.

#### • Beaufort-Lexton Road

- Pavement patching from Topp Lane to Jack Smiths Lane completed.
- Drainage clearing works near Chute Lexton Road intersection—completed.
- Landslip cleanup (repair pf eroded shoulders) at three locations—in progress.
- Reinstatement of eroded shoulder at various locations—in progress.
- Scour and repair of culverts at various locations—in progress.

#### Maryborough-St Arnaud Road

 Culvert repair and clearing between Dunolly-Avoca Road and Homebush Road—in progress.

## Stawell-Avoca Road

 Cleaning of debris from multiple culverts and bridge substructures between Sycamores Road and Moonambel-Natte Yallock Road—in progress.

### Pyrenees Highway

- Repair and clearing of structures and culverts at six locations between Elmhurst and Avoca—in progress.
- Shoulder works to reinstate eroded shoulder at three locations between Elmhurst and Avoca—in progress.

## Flood Inquiry

Victoria's major floods of October 2022 are subject to a parliamentary inquiry. The Legislative Council Environment and Planning Committee will investigate the state's preparedness for and response to the disaster and is calling for public submissions. The Committee is accepting written submissions until 8 May 2023. Pyrenees Shire Council will be putting forward a submission. If you have any comments to make please contact the Flood Recovery Team.

## WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING?

### BlazeAid Team

The BlazeAid team have now completed their works program in the Pyrenees. BlazeAid volunteers, camped at the Moonambel Recreation Reserve, were very busy with fence repairs. Since commencing in December 2022, team members have cleared 46km of damaged fencing and built 21km of new fencing for 42 residents. The crew have contributed 900 volunteer working days.

On behalf of Council, we would like to thank BlazeAid team members for their tireless work in helping the residents of Pyrenees. Residents have been full of praise for the assistance that has been provided. Council would also like to thank the Moonambel Recreation Reserve Committee for hosting the BlazeAid Team.

### Waste pick-up

If you still have flood damaged carpets, whitegoods, furniture or sandbags that need collecting, call Council to organise collection. No general household waste, building materials or hazardous materials such as asbestos will be picked up. You can call Council to find out how to dispose of these items.

## LOOKING AFTER YOURSELF (VERY IMPORTANT)

Emergencies such as floods can be disruptive and stressful, and the recovery process can take time. Whether you have been directly impacted, volunteering or supporting others, it's really important to look after yourself. Some great tips for self care are:

- Spend time with people who care
- Give yourself time
- Try to keep a routine going ie. Eating, sleeping, work, study
- Set realistic goals that keep you motivated, but don't take on too much.
- Talk about how you feel (the ups and downs) with friends, family and health professionals, when you are ready.
