PROJECTS

Roadworks Beaufort-Carranballac Road

Construction is nearing completion on Beaufort-Carranballac Road (1.5km to 2.3km south of Meadows Lane). Sealing works were completed on 19 March with final tidy up works to be completed within the next month.

Roadworks Eurambeen-Streatham Road

Works will begin shortly on Eurambeen-Streatham Road, south of Mt William Road near Coburn Rd. Works will cause some traffic delays and are scheduled for completion in May.

Roadworks Trawalla Waterloo Road

Construction in underway on Trawalla Waterloo Road near Racecourse Road. Culvert works requiring the closure of Trawalla Waterloo Road between Racecourse Road and Rodger's Drive will be completed over the next few weeks. The remaining road works are scheduled for completion by late-May. These works will cause some traffic delays.

Avoca drainage maintenance

Avoca drainage maintenance work has started. Efforts will be in place to minimise the impact to motorists and pedestrians. Pound Lane will be closed for a few days for the installation of two culverts.

Caramuir Road, Nerring culvert works

Upgrade work on the Caramuir Road culvert is underway. Works include the extension of the existing culvert, road reinstatement, and installation of guard railing. The road will be closed during works, please follow the detour signs. We apologise for any inconvenience.

Roadworks Smythesdale-Snake Valley Road

Construction work is almost complete on Smythesdale-Snake Valley Road (Hopes Lane to 150m south of Canico Lane). Remaining tidy up works should be done this week with line marking completed when contractors are in the area.

Roadworks Pittong Snake Valley Road

Works will begin shortly on Pittong Snake Valley Road near Cochrane Drive. Works include pavement upgrades and sealing of the unsealed road between Kelly Road and Cochrane Drive. Works will cause some traffic delays.
