

Transfer stations

Transfer stations are located in Avoca, Beaufort, Landsborough and Snake Valley. Drop-off of domestic waste, green waste, e-waste, batteries, scrap steel and recycling is free of charge for residents. Fees are charged for items such as tyres, oil and mattresses.

Note: Landsborough Transfer Station will not accept mattresses, batteries, tyres, construction materials, gas bottles or refrigerators.

E-Waste

Since 2019, it has been illegal to dispose of e-waste in household rubbish or landfill in Victoria. However, you can dispose of these items legally and for free at e-waste collection points at the Beaufort, Avoca and Snake Valley transfer stations.

E-waste is any item that has a plug, battery or power cord and includes e-cigarettes, televisions, computers, mobile phones and battery operated toys.



How often are my bins collected?

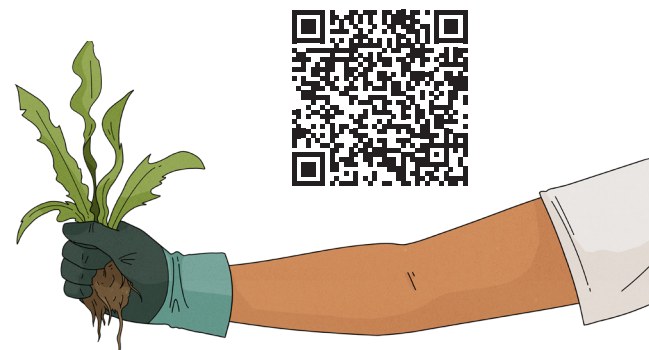
Beaufort and Avoca

- Landfill: 120L red-lidded bin - weekly
- Recycling: 240L yellow-lidded bin - fortnightly
- Green waste: 240L green-lidded bin - every four weeks
- Glass: 120L purple-lidded bin - every four weeks

Rural (areas outside of Beaufort and Avoca)

- Landfill: 240L red-lidded bin - fortnightly
- Recycling: 240L yellow-lidded bin - fortnightly
- Glass: 120L purple-lidded bin - every four weeks

What goes in each bin

Not in any bin: electronic waste (e-waste), power cords, batteries of any kind, chemicals or hazardous waste, building waste, soil or rubble. Scan the QR code to find out where to dispose of these items.



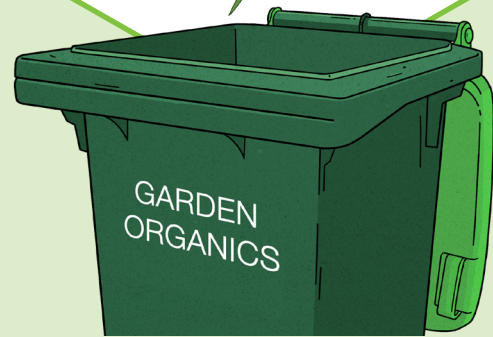
Green waste

Garden clippings only.

Put your garden scraps in the bin loose, not in bags.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Grass clippings
- ✓ Weeds
- ✓ Small branches (max 100mm wide x 400mm long)
- ✓ Garden prunings
- ✓ Twigs



✗ No

Nappies, plastic bags, recyclables, kitty litter, large branches, tree stumps, liquids, food scraps or household waste, plastic pots, soil or rubble, garden hose, animal droppings or carcasses.

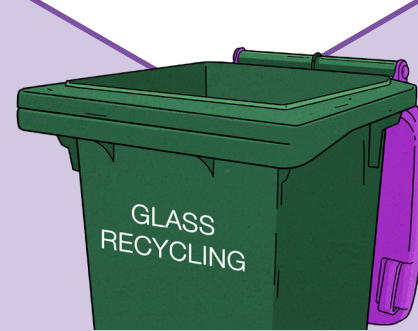
Glass recycling

Put lightly rinsed, empty glass bottles and jars into the bin loose, not in bags.

Lids, bottle caps and jar lids must be removed and put in your mixed recycling bin.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Glass bottles including beer, wine and olive oil bottles
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars for medicine or toiletries
- ✓ Glass jars including pasta sauce and condiment jars



✗ No

Vases, light bulbs, drinking glasses or broken glass. Also no plastic bags or packaging, loose lids and caps from bottles or jars, corks, pumps, sprays, droppers, cardboard, crockery or cookware.

Mixed recycling

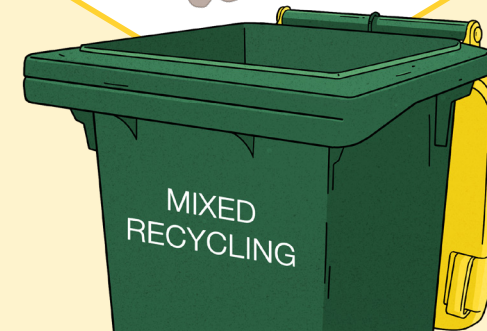
Put your recycling in the bin loose, not in bags.

Flatten boxes to save space.

Glass no longer goes in this bin.

✓ Yes *Codes 1, 2 and 5*

- ✓ Plastic bottles and containers
- ✓ Aluminium and steel tins, cans
- ✓ Lids, bottle caps and jars lids
- ✓ Cardboard, cereal boxes, egg cartons, unsoiled pizza boxes
- ✓ Paper, newspapers, magazines, paper envelopes



✗ No

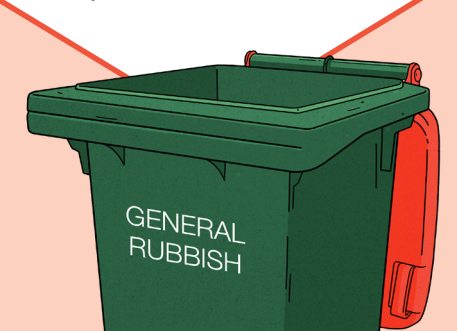
Plastic bags, other soft plastics, clothing, shoes, textiles, coated, waxed or soiled cardboard, electronic waste and batteries, glass, crockery, polystyrene (styrofoam).

Landfill

Use this bin only for items that can't be reused or recycled.

✓ Yes

- ✓ Crockery, mirrors and broken glass (wrapped in newspaper)
- ✓ Nappies and wipes, kitty litter, animal droppings
- ✓ Long-life cartons, coffee cups
- ✓ Old clothing, shoes or textiles that can't be repaired or donated



✗ No

Electronic waste (e-waste) or batteries, garden waste, household chemicals, paint tins, motor oil, recyclable items, soil, building materials.
