



## PYRENEES SHIRE COUNCIL LAUNCHES NEW SOFT PLASTICS RECYCLING PROGRAM



Pyrenees Shire Council has officially launched a new Soft Plastics Recycling Program, giving residents an easy way to recycle more household packaging and reduce waste going to landfill.

Under the scheme, households can put their soft plastics into special orange bags and place them into kerbside recycling bins to be made into new Australian products.

### What can go in the soft plastics bags?

- Plastic bags
- Biscuit and other snack wrappers
- Chip packets and other silver-lined snack wrappers
- Fresh and frozen food and vegetable wrappers or bags
- Pasta bags, rice bags (both plastic and woven types), bead bags (without the tie), and cereal liners
- Cling wrap, bubble wrap, and snap lock/zip lock bags
- Document sleeves, mail satchels and carrier bags
- Plastic pet food bags and clean potting mix bags

This free and optional service is part of Council's commitment to helping the community recycle more materials, reduce contamination in bins, and cut down on waste sent to landfill.

Full orange soft plastic recycling bags can be placed in kerbside recycling bins from 2 March 2026.

Residents can register for the program now by phoning 1300 797 363 to receive their supply of orange bags.

### Expanded support for fire affected communities

The Victorian and Australian governments have announced additional support to help families, businesses and primary producers affected by the recent fires.

This includes funding for:

- Clean-up support for homes, structures and community assets
- Recovery support to help people access government programs and services
- Advice and financial counselling for small business owners
- Rebates to rural households for cleaning and decontaminating rain water tanks, roofs and gutters
- Additional mental health and

### Fire damaged trees on roadsides

Following the Streatham Yalla-Y-Poora fire, many trees located near roads have been impacted.

Pyrenees Shire Council is currently undertaking assessments of fire-affected trees located close to roads. Trees identified as hazardous will be scheduled for removal over the coming weeks to ensure public safety.

The fire also damaged or destroyed many trees on farms in the area. These trees play an important role on farms, providing wind breaks, shade for stock and preventing erosion.

If trees on your property were damaged or destroyed in the recent fire, you may be eligible to apply for replacement plantings.

Agriculture Victoria has a program that provides grants to rural landowners seeking to replace trees affected by the recent fires.

### Speed Sign Changes – Safe Local Roads and Streets Program

Works are progressing on changes to speed signage across Pyrenees Shire.

Roads and townships affected include:

- Kings St, Beaufort – 50km/h zone entering Beaufort/Gateway signs
- Old Shirley Rd, Beaufort – 80km/h zone between the rail crossing and Western Hwy
- Raglan Township – 60km/hr zones on Vaughan Street, Chute-Raglan Road and Codrington Street, 80km/hr zone entering Raglan from Eurambeen-Raglan Road.
- Waubra Township – Waubra-Beaufort Road and Waubra-Talbot Road - 60km/hr zone (Completed).
- Snake Valley Township – South part of the township with 80km/hr zone on Linton-Carngham Road between Pittong Snake Valley Road and the shire boundary, 60km/hr zone on

Laurence Drive and a 50km/hr zone of Cochrane Drive with signage updates to Pittong-Snake Valley Road.

- Amphitheatre Township – Amphitheatre Road 60km/h zone over the rail crossing and signage updates around the school (Completed)
- Trawalla Township – 60km/h zones in front of the school and over the railway line
- Evansford Township – 60km/hr zones through Evansford where the current 70km/hr zone is and other signage updates (will be completed as part of the road construction)

These changes have been funded by TAC's Safe Local Roads and Streets Program.

## CURRENT ROADWORKS

### Eurambeen-Streatham and Mt William Road – Intersection

In response to a fatal road traffic accident late last year, works are being undertaken at the Eurambeen-Streatham and Mt William Road. Additional line marking was completed in December 2025, and 80km/hr zone speed limit signage will be installed this month. Temporary advisory signage currently in place on the Mt William Road will remain until these works are completed.

Council has also made an application for funding for a major intersection treatment at this intersection. The outcome of that application is still to be determined.
